# SELPA AUTISM PROGRAM NEWS / HIGHLIGHTS



Our program has adopted the element "GOLD" as our symbol. Not only does the AU represent Autism, but it also represents the fact that our students & families are precious, rare, and highly valued.

The SELPA Autism Team supports over 30 classes in five member school districts, providing two additional placement types on the SELPA's continuum of placement options that are available to students with disabilities based upon unique needs. In recent years, the SELPA's Autism Coordinator, Jennifer Wolfe, was selected as the Regional Lead for our region of Southern California representing the California Autism Professional Training and Information Network (CAPTAIN). This grant award required the SELPA to lead capacity building activities related to evidence-based practices for individuals with Autism throughout our SELPA and larger region, which has included developing our SELPA Autism Implementation Team (SAIT) and more recently has focused on developing our Demonstration Site at Gladstone Elementary in Bonita USD. The Gladstone Elementary programs will serve as the exemplar demonstration site in the years to come, allowing for districts throughout our region to similarly build capacity in the EBPs that are effective for individuals on the Autism spectrum.

#### **CALPADS CORNER**





All Special Education (SPED) related fatal Certification Validation Rules (CVRs) and certification data discrepancies (CDDs) that were temporarily moved to "warnings" on Tuesday, November 30, 2022, returned to fatal errors on Tuesday, December 20, 2022. Any revisions during this time are now obsolete and LEAs must take action on revisions dated after December 20, 2022. LEAs with remaining SPED-related fatal errors should disapprove their revisions dated prior to December 20th and work on the most current "Revised Uncertified" revision.

Final Fall 1 certification is due on January 20th, 2023. For technical support or assistance with CALPADS, please contact Lucky Do at Ido@esgvselpa.org

Through the AB-130 Omnibus Trailer Bill, enacted by the legislature and Governor Newsom in the 2021-2022 school year, the SELPA received significant funding for both Dispute Prevention/Dispute Resolution and Learning Recovery for students with disabilities impacted by the COVID-19 school closures. After allocating funding to all member LEAs, the SELPA has been working closely with the LEAs to monitor expenditures and progress towards implementing plans developed in collaboration with the SELPA. The next progress report for all LEAs is due to the SELPA by January 15th, 2023, and will be used to provide technical assistance to LEAs and./or consider possible adjustments in allocation in order to ensure that all funds are encumbered by June 30th, 2023 and fully expended by September 30th, 2023. ### TRANSPORTATION CORNER


















#### **CAC SANTA'S WISH LIST CONTEST**
